We would like to invite all our kindergarten students to take part in the October lessons. This month we will have a closer look at different types of weather, we will try to rescue some unpaired socks, practice counting when picking up mushrooms and get to know some Halloween traditions.



What have we prepared for this month?

We will begin this month by exploring the topic that is present in our daily lives. We will look outside the window and learn to name the weather we see. Older kids will be singing [The Sun Comes Up!](#) whereas the younger ones [How's The Weather?](#).

In the second week of October, we will be naming clothes that we usually wear when we go outside to play. Children in older groups will take part in a class project called 'Design your T-shirt'. Children will learn to talk about their designs, too. We will be singing the following songs: [What Are You Wearing?](#) (older kids) and [Clothes Names Song](#) (younger students). The youngest children will take on a challenge to pair up some unpaired socks. We will be learning to recognize colours and patterns.

In the third week, we will go to an imaginary forest to learn the names of some objects that could come in handy during a camping trip. Younger students will go mushroom-picking and will count the mushrooms in their baskets.

The last week of October will be all about Halloween. We are in for a lot of fun with some aspects of English culture. We will learn vocabulary connected to Halloween. It's a very important holiday for the Anglo-Saxon world and an inseparable element of the English language. This topic cannot be skipped in any English language course! In the future, the children will find out why all the pumpkins, witches and monsters are part of the tradition. Do you, dear Parent, know what is Halloween all about?

The last week of October will be fully devoted to ... big, small, round, green or orange pumpkins. We will learn some adjectives to describe different types of pumpkins. All students will sing the song [Big, big, big](#) in order to better remember new vocabulary. Young children will sing [Pumpkin Man](#) when playing the pumpkin version of "hide and seek" and older children will talk about different meals that we can prepare with the pumpkin.



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
