

We are well aware of how important reading is for language education! Our classes regularly feature both the famous classics of English-language children's literature, as well as less popular titles, which our academic senior team passionately hunt for at fairs, in thrift shops in the UK and in language bookstores. You can find them all <u>on our Spotify playlist</u>! Each month some new songs that children are going to learn in class will appear there.

# What have we prepared for this month?

This month all age groups will begin by setting off on a book adventure! We will get to know one of the most popular English classics <u>We're going on a Bear Hunt</u> by Michaela Rosen. In our last training, the speak:art teachers learned how to read this book to involve and engage our young learners to the fullest. The story will take us travelling through meadows, forests and valleys looking for a bear. We will be singing <u>Going on a Bear Hunt</u> and in żłobek <u>Are You Sleeping, Baby Bear?</u> will be the main theme song.

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In the second week, we will travel to Africa! We will go on a safari and learn the names of wild animals. Older groups will sing <u>What Do You See?</u> and the younger ones <u>Safari Animals Finger Family</u> <u>Song</u>. Children in the nursery will focus on playing with monkeys and the well-known song <u>Five Little</u> <u>Monkeys</u>.

In the third week, we will talk about what activities animals can or cannot do. Older children will learn the song <u>Yes, I can</u> and the younger and youngest ones - <u>Animals Actions Song</u>. We will also tell each other about our skills. Are we as fit as monkeys, snakes or tigers?

In the last week, we will be learning to talk about everyday activities. The song <u>What Do You Do Every</u> <u>Day?</u> will help the older children to consolidate new vocabulary, and the younger ones will be singing <u>Morning Routine</u>. Younger children will focus on what they do every morning. In nurseries, we will revise the names of body parts and sing <u>The Bath Song</u>.
